Do you espouse any set of specific beliefs or values?

What is the point of your music?

JO:To be loud and to be louder and annoy people by our loudness and our feedback. And have fun.

TAYLIA: For me, the point is to enjoy myself with the rest of the band & occastonally an audience (if we're playing live) playing music that I like.

MARK: The point of our music is to change the world. I honestly believe that music has the power to do this. I mean when I'm jammin' on my guitar I get this incredible feeling that the world is in transition; it's on the edge of an immense precipise. and if only I could turn up my amp beyond lo it would be pushed over into the land of peace, love and anarchy. I don't think my amp is powerful enough, I've got to get a new one. But you know it's rough being a punk-living hand-to-mouth on the streets, spending all the money you get panhandling on cigarettes, beer, an occasional burrito, spikes, studs, and hair dye. It's a rough life, but it's necessary-you know?



What are your future recording plans?

We have a live tape, LIVE ASTALL GET OUT!, which will be out on Deus Ex Machina by the time you read this. It covers 1979 to 1983 and has 26 songs with an emmense variety of material. Some other projects may surface in 184....

What bands have you played with, local and national, that you liked or disliked?

STEVE: I have yet to play a show with EPP but I liked Really Red & Savage Republic when they played with EPP. Some local bands are really cool such as the U-men, 10 Minute Warning, and Malfunkshun...

What do you think is wrong with America today?

TAYLIA: Too many people are too concerned about getting more sex, money, and power over others.


NEW WAVE COMES OF AGE IN ... ANCHORAGE!

Henry Rollins

Black Flag has to be one of the most well known punk bands in the world. If you havent heard a lot about these guys recently it's because they haven't been doing much lately besides the big "take-em-to court" thing with Unicorn records, because Greg Ginn and Chuck Dukowski released a BLACK FLAG double album of eariler released material with. vocals and music from past and present members of BLACK FLAG. The album is called "Everything went Black". The cover for the record was unusual because any where the B.F. name or logo appeared it was marked out or spray painted over due to something about copyrights.

What's happening with Black Flag now? I wanted to know so I gave Henry a call and here's what came

out of it.

Right now Henry is helping Greg Ginns dad build a house and living in a van somewhere, thanks to greg's folks he's eating regularly now.

At the time I called Greg and Chuck were still doing time so there wasn't much going on with them. So I tried to find out a few things about the vocalist for Black Flag... Henry Rollins....things WARNING readers might like to know.

Henry's tatoos are becoming world famous and a Europeon magazine just did a photo session with Henry and he's designing more tatoos to have imbedded beneth his skin (Watch for Henry's new tatoos ...OUT SOON on

his right and left arms).

If you've ever seen a BLACK FLAG show live and have seen the physical abuse Rollins puts his self through during a gig then you'll probably understand when Henry claims that he's had to be hospitalized at least once on just about every tour. Rollin says"If I don't put my life on the line during a gig then I just didn't do a good show."

During a gig Henry has been known to wear little or nothing at all during a performance, "It shakes up the crowd " he says. Abuse from the crowd is not uncommon to Rollins.

who is often kicked, knocked down, punched and has thingsthrown at him during a show but, on stage Henry holds his ground and believes that it's up to him to also protect the musicians who are also members of the band, "I live Black Flag!" claims Henry, "BLACK FLAG is the hardest playing band in the world, you can spray paint that on any wall and sign my name to it".

In response to the hair thing Rollins reply was simple, "I usta be a singer in a punk band with no hair, now I'm a singer in a punk band with hair...so what?"

Henry doesn't really claim to have any musical influnces but latly he's been listening to a lot of classic stuff from the 30's and 40's.

I wonder what the next B.F. album will sound like? Ever wonder what Henry was doing before BLACK FLAG...well he played in another band on the east coast and worked at a Hagen Daus ice cream parlor.

Henry Rollins is a loner and at times (maybe) hard to understand but he's everything he claims to be "I'm somebody doing my own thing".

SUICIDAL TENDENCIES are fast becoming one of the most popular punk bands in L.A. It startedabout 3 years ago with 4 guys who just wanted to play music together. Since then there has been a few changes with members and attitudes towards taking this musician thing more seriousaly.

Well the band practiced and played anywhere they could and started to develop quite a local following, at first the band was not excepted by others outside their local fans because of their style of dress. Suicidal Tendencies is much different from your stereotype punk, they din't where leather and spikes, etc. They look more like mexican street gang members, which shook up other punks (or should I say self proclaimed punks) and some club owners. Roumers claiming that Suicidal Tendencies were a gang , which is far from the truth. Suicidal Tendencies is a band! And just like any other band they have fans, which just like any other fans will show their support by dressing and displaying your name very proudly and in the neighborhood these guys come from to have somthing to believe in makes lots of things more positive.

Mike Muir, singer for the band is amazed at how fast the groups popularity has grown the past few months. Most of this fast growing popularity can be credited to the song "Instutionalized" (from S.T.'s only record to date) which has received lots of airplay on radio station KROQ, located in L.A. Muir says "We didn't do that song to get airplay, we did it cause

it fits into our set. The thing with KROQ was just luck. It'll never happen again".

"Because everyone can relate to it."
Since the bands begining there has been a couple of personal changes, the most recent has been the replacement of guitar player Grant Estes with John Nelson (Estes played on the album) other than that if you go to a S.T. gig Mike Muir is still doing vocals, Louie is on bass and Amery will be beating the drums.

What else can I tell you about this band?....These guys are very high energy, fast paced and great live (at least that's what I heard.)

They were voted worst band and biggest assholes in FLIPSIDE fanzine 1982 poll. (something tells me this was a mistake).

The second pressing of their album is probably in the racks by now (or available through the mail).

Most of the band members have other jobs to support themselves because mike says"You can never really make money playing in a punk band".

The airplay and name recognition from "Instutionalized" has made booking gigs for the band a lot eaiser, so they're planning a U.S. Tour and the way things look now the only place Suicidal Tendencies won't be is... ALASKA (that's right Alaska!) oh well. Watch for these guys in your town

if they show up ...go to the show!

GLEN FRIEDMAN a unique individual who has played an important role in spreading the news about the Hardcore/Punk movement, starting from it's early stages to today. Friedman isn't a member of a band. He's a photographer, so you'll rarely see pictures of him cause he spends most of his time behind the camera, but you should recognize his name. Friedman was shooting photos for Skateboarder and Action Now magazines since he was 14. At age 21 Friedman has probably done more to put skateboarding and punk music together then any one person. How? You ask...

Friedman was the primary motivator in grtting Hardcore bands coverage in national publications. By getting his photos and stories in Skateboarder magazine Friedman was able to introduce hardcore to skate kids and surfer kids who weren't living in the L.A. area or places where there wasn't a scene.

Friedman's photographs have also been published in SOUNDS from England, N, M, E., ROLLING STONE, CREEM, CIRCUS, TIME, NEWSWEEK, THRASHER and FLIPSDE fanzine to name a few. Friedman has contributed to many assorted publications but many weren't interested in covering the hardcore scene, so to keep photos from becoming dated Friedman published his own magazine called "MY RULES" (titled after the song by Black Flag). "MY RULES"is a photozine and features photo photos of over 30 different punk bands. Over 7,000 copies have been sold to date. Friedman takes photography very seriousaly and his opinion of photographers in general, "All photographers have something weird about them, they're either total geeks or complete excentrics.99% fit into the lower catagory".

Glen Friedman's future looks very busy too. He recently produced Suicidal Tendencies first L.P. and is also helping promote them. Friedman believes S.T. is going to be the hottest new punk band for the 80's so watch their growth.

"Glen is there anything you would -

like to say?"

"....0'kay...people just have to remember to think for themselves and not really give a shit bout what their peers are saying and stuff, you just have to have integrity and sincerity and this is everything. No matter what your thing is it is important, cause you're fully into it and if you're not going to be 100% then...."



I was recently asked to speak at Stellar Alternative School, on the subject of Punk. I was excited & scared at the same time. I'd never talked to a large group of people before, especially where my lifestyle was to be the focus of attention. Well I managed to live through it and I'd like to tell you about my day at Stellar.

To be perfectly honest, I was antisipating alot of hostility from the students. Bill Bored had visited earlier in the year and came up against alot of "misinformed" young people. Much to my relief, the students asked alot of good questions about the music, the various "looks", the politics and my own personal experiences connected with my chosen lifestyle.

I brought books, music, pictures, other fanzines and WARNING'S latest issue. Anything I felt that might help make these young people understand punk better. I noticed a big change in attitudes towards punk, they were more curious than skeptical. We became quite involved in politics, which I enjoyed thoroughly. I tried to explain the reasons behind the visual shock which exists in many ways throughout the sub-culture ie; names of bands, cover designs on albums, safety pins and hairstyles being the main visual effect.

All in all I believe my visit went alright. I hope I opened the minds of some of these young people. The wonders of media like Quincy has set us back a long way in the public's eye. I promote a Straight Edge attitude in my everyday living & that is what is promoted throughout the fanzine. I was asked to stay & talk to two other classes.
