Later, "Warning" stopped showing up here in Honolulu for awhile and I went without it until a second issue popped up a few weeks back. I was suprised and pleased. Now I will fill you in on the happenings here on what we like to call "The Rock".


The scene over here is minimal, consisting of perhaps 400-500 persons (this is a selection of gig turn-outs). There isn't any real place for bands to play, but there are some hot local bands (these include Scarred For Life, Something Really Offensive, The Falloux, The Whirling Dervishes, The Silents, and a new band called the Vaccum. By the way, only the first three bands are what one really might call "hardcore". The Falloux are commie punks, Scarred For Life (S.F.L.) is a skate-band, and (S.R.O.) is a thrash band. On the other hand, Whirling Dervishes are psycedelic, The Silents are inexplicable, and the Vaccum something close to that.) Oh, let me not forget Devil Dog. They only have a ... three-song repertoire, but they have lots of potential to be a hot band.

As far as reading goes, there is a fanzine called "Thrash and Tool", which is good, shatter orientated (I think). They just had their first anniversery, and it looks like they'll be going strong in Hawaii for some time. Other than that, the only thing comparitive to a fanzine is my own publication, Sects Kit-10 (pronounced Sex Kitten, for the more dense of your readers) which is going into it's 4th issue. It's not really a fanzine (call it a magazine or a ragazine instead). because it's not strictly Punk orientated, for personal reasons. (I am not a punk by choice, you see, only by definition.) Actually it's a rather cynical publication that has put down punks in the past (not to mention Mods, New Romantics. and Death Rockers), not directly but by way of putting down labels in general. Well I'll send you a copy, you can evaluate.



"Little Bobby Hanson"- about a local rapist "Indy 500"



D.O.A. finished their set and came back with an encore that brought the audience to their feet (again) and singing along with the band as they did their version of "North to Alaska".

Skate Death is an Anchorage based garage band with a growing following. This year the fams will increase exceptionally. As for the album, the tracs are sharp, full of energy, and to put into layman's terms, "Clean Thrash."

As for the album, what it lacks in complex music structure. It

. As for the album, what it lacks in complex music structure. It makes up for in idealogical lyrics containing humor, wit, and athical conflicts within the realm of teenagers existence. It is what some people refer to as "Poetry of the Youth." Or in other words, "Rock N Roll." There would be no reason to compare this work to work from any other group. They are all original recordings. Besides it isn't fair to compare unless there are features that are similar. Skate Death is in a class all by itself. As Natalie put it, (who also happens to be the girlfriend of Kelly Herbert), "Each song is unique."

Overall, it is an expressive composite of music that is both enjoyable and thought provoking.







This band is creating from another place and time; yet still offers the musical expression needed to satisfy music lovers. Definitely worth experiencing.







TV LIKE NEVER BEFORE:

(under ground video for the home)

Ever since the invention of video tape people have talked about the many horizons that it has opened up. Currently it looks like the punk scene is the only group checking out those horizons. While most people are using their VCR's to watch Friday the 13th Part 8, punks have hit the ground running. Fanzines are being put on tape, local bands can make their own videos sometimes before they even have albums and cult movies that would never be played in commercial theatres can be rented or bought. Video tape is freedom and communication on an international scale. My specialty is cult films so going into punk video was a natural progression.

Fanzines have been one of the most influential parts of the scene. It was in 1982 that Flipside, a fanzine out of Whittier California, put out it's first video fanzine. It had footage of early Black Flag, T.S.O.L., Sin 34, Social Distortion, Husker Du, and many others. There were interviews and music with D.I. and the Vandals, some pretty interesting stuff done right after the filming of Suburbia. A ten minute interview with M.D.C., where they try to explain why their name isn't really Millions of Dead Cops, calls for some creative fast forwarding. It's best, however, to watch the first time since the people who make them like to throw in good stuff not to mention it on the box. There is a good montage of New Wave and older stills on #1.

#2 had work by White Flag, Big Boys, Stretch Marks, Minor Threat, Angst, and 7 Seconds to name a few. 100-Flowers did its last gig and the stand up comics of punk, The Dickies, play with phallic hand puppets. I like the Dickies but if you get offended by sexist sillyness, then you might not. Watch for the Quiz Break.

The tape that came closest to what a fanzine does, rather than just feature clips of various bands, was #3. There is a interesting talk by G.I. Joe about anarchism and living for free. Gary Indiana, who does a column for Flipside, discusses deal ing with the long arm of the law and there is a pretty intelligent interview with M.I.A One thing that became obvious from watching both the Flipside tapes and ones featuring individual bands is that doing interviews must be a real pain in the ass. I'm not saying that it is necessary to be serious for an interview to work but it would be a good idea for the bands to remember that the tapemaker is on their side. Their is music by Agent Orange, Big Boys, Confederate, Mad Parade, and Ionclast. The Dickies are back but not nearly as funny, mostly because they aren't doing their own music.

Taken from their 83 and 84 tours, Flpiside #4 takes a different track and is strictly about G.B.H. Each song is introduced by one of the audience or a band member talking about what the song means to them. There are inter-

views with the band, roadies and the manager. At times Brit Boys starts to look alot like Carl Ryners Spinal Tap, especially when GBH does Hell Hole.

I noticed that Flipside #5 was the first tape to have bands with women or minorities. There is a short interview with Conflict about it but there is no good explanation as to why most punk bands are white males. There is music by Decry, Heart Attack, Justice Leage, Bad Religion, and Vaginal Dentata.

The videozines got progressively better in terms of production values over the years. Each tape has work by 10 to 15 bands, I only mentioned the ones that stood out. #6 is out as of this column but I was not able to see it. The good word is that #7 which is currently in production will have a couple of Alaska bands on it. If you are interested write to:

Alaska Underground and will feature visiting bands as well as local ones. If there

us at Warning and be recorded for posterity.

The thing that impressed me the most was just how many people are involved with making tapes about the scene and the variety of forms the tapes take. Live concerts, stu-



dio work, and compilations make up the bull of whats being done.

Louder, Faster, Shorter, is live concert tape originally shot on 16mm. Five bands play at a benifit concert in San Francisco during the 1978 miners strike. Called Punks Against Black Lung, the concert was a huge success. UXA, Dils, Avengers, Sleepers, and the Mutants all put on good performances, leaving one wishing for more.

Target Video started in 1978 and like most of the other independent tape companys is on the West Coast, San Francisco to be exact. Their Underground Forces tapes feature such diverse bands as Black Flag and Throbbing Gristle. Each tape includes teasers of other bands as well as some of the best video montage work taken from movies and news that I have ever seen. Some of it is very graphic but then so is life. I

liked the Black Flag tape but wound up using the Trobbing Gristle tape as background noise to clean house to.

R.I.A. does some very good studio work with both Flipper and Code of Honor. While I have to admit that the control factor must be nice I would have liked to see a little more live footage. Since Flipper is no longer together there is one more example of the 'magic of video!' As unstable as punk bands are its nice to be able to follow them on tape. Flipper works hard to prove that they are indeed the most obnoxious band in punk while Code of Honor does a very professional job, marred by some sloppy effects. While good effects can make a video into a statement, bad ones detract and cheapen good music. Simple, clean, live, tape has alot more impact then most split screen, double exposure, and lap dissolve effects. And anybody who puts strobe lights on a tape should have their Kneecaps broken. Not only is it boring but for one in a thousand of us born with epilepsy they can cause light induced sei-

There are a number of other tapes out that I would like to see and if you have access to them I promise to protect them with my life. They are; UK/DK-a video about punks and skinheads, BAHAUS-shadow of light, JOY DIVISION, NEW ORDER, BIRTHDAY PARTY, CRAMPS a Target video done at the Napa Valley Mental Institute, CHROME BOX, and ALIEN SEX FIEND.

The main problem with most of these es are that they are so hard to get. The



only one I know of that you can rent from the local video parlors is D.O.A. having nothing to do with the band of the same name D.O.A. is basically a documentary of the Sex Pistols Amerika tour. Slickly made and well edited it was done in 16mm and later transferred to tape. Its a bit explotive but its worth it just for the lyric notes for the Sex Pistols songs. Next...Cult Movies






