# MINOR THREAT TO WHOM?"

As Ian MacKaye hunches over a plate of meager chicken in a downtown Nashville eatery, it's difficult to imagine him as anything other than your typical skinhead punker. While the 20-year-old MacKaye would prefer not to be singled out as anyone special, his five member D.C. hardcore band Minor Threat is, to a growing faction of American punks, giving a new direction to punk rock.

Which seems odd. MacKaye doesn't drink, smoke or do drugs. Nor does he hate cops or government or condone civil disobedience. He calls it having the "Straight Edge" and his philosophies have grown from a mere song off the band's first Discord Records EP some two years ago into a veritable clan of followers from D.C. to L.A.

Some how, MacKaye seems to have strayed from punk roots, at least in the ideological sense. Sure, he has the usual trademarks: a five o' clock shadow instead of hair, the tattered jeans, T-shirt and sneakers And onstage, he comes across as "str ght" as a Suma wrestler drunk on firewater. But since when were people like MacKaye considered "true" punks?

Since Minor Threat. About three years ago, during the period when MacKaye and MT drummer Jeff Nelson, 20, became Ex-teen idles, MacKaye says he came to grips with what really nettled him about the then-prevalent punk lifestyle. He saw his friends fry their circurity with chemicals and booze and on their way down the drain -- the wrong brand of rebellion, he thought. He felt he had the "edge" over these people and coined the phrase "Straight Edge" for his personal alternative.

That phrase later became a favorite MT song and started popping up



painted on the backs of leather jackets and walls. "The whole thing simply grew out of people's frustrations in others who would tell them they weren't cool because they didn't get involved in all that peer-pressure stuff," explains guitarist Lyle Preslar, 19. "Ian, and people like him, got back at others by saying, 'Hey we're Straight Edge, we've got the edge over people who are fucking up their lives and we're gonna prove you're not uncool

by being straight''"

Preslar, former vocalist (before Henry Rollins of current Black Flag fame) for the disbanded DC band State of Alert, joined forces with MacKaye, Nelson and bassist-cumguitarist Brian Baker, 18, in November 1980 to form Minor Threat.

Influenced mainly by DC's Bad Brains, whom MacKaye dubbs "the first East Coast band to play

really fast music," MT began gig-ging a month later and quickly rose to dominate the youthful DC scene. "I'd like to think DC bands like the Untouchables, SOA, Teen Idles and us had an original sound that other bands tended to <u>copy</u>," says MacKaye, stabbing a fork in his plate for emphasis, "but purely for

a personal feeling, y'know?"
What gives this "original sound" of Minor Threat's such a peculiar chomp is its lack of over-used apolitical babble. "We have our political beliefs," notes Preslar hesitantly. "but we don't feel inhesitantly. clined to echo those beliefs in our songs or feel that national and international politics are musical forms. It's not necessarily a positive thing, either, to get up on stage and scream about politics. We feel if you can instead deal with things on a personal level like with the person sitting next to you, you can probably get a lot more accomplished in society. Maybe you'll be able to convince some asshole that he doesn't need to be that way, and you'll both probably feel better in the outcome."

MacKaye nods in agreement: "Take a look at the songs on our new (third) EP. All eight songs are basically about friendship, a lot of it based on personal experience. 'Look Back and Laugh' is about how even though you sometimes have to put up with a lot of shit to continue a friendship, it's worth it.
'Betrayed' is about how fucked some friends can be 'cause they leave you hanging. 'Sob Story' is against people who feel scrry for themselves all the time and think life's a bitch..." he frowns as his words are drowned out by the restaurant's weepy country-music jukebox.

Later that night, the Threat's take front-row seats in the cramped, sleazy Cantrell's nightclub to check out their opening acts, Committee For Public Safety (Nashville) and Malignant Growth (Louisville, Ky.). The

small dance floor remains unusally empty and the sparse, unenthusiastic audience of New Wave clones wonder audience of New Wave clones wonder how the very normal looking guys (excepting MacKaye, of course) up front dare show they're having a good time. This is NASHVILLE, not LA. "In the last town we played on this tour," says Preslar, "we had

this tour." says Preslar, "we ha an audience just like this, with maybe 20 people. It's weird, but I think we were able to keep the energy going better than ever that night, even though there was hardly any audience reaction. The people in the audience were cool, but we pulled toge ther to give them the best show we could." This particular show is MT's second major U.S. assault and covers about 30 dates in some 60 days. "It's interesting to go from a scene like this or the last gig in Charlotte (N.C.) to what it'll probably be like in California, with 2,000 or 3,000 at a gig..." "No. millions, I hope," jokes MacKaye."

The only thing Preslar says he isn't looking forward to out west is potentially ugly confrontations with bent punkers, ricts and diffi-culties with police. I see LA, at least in the past, as having a lot of violence and corruption in its scene, even though LA has some of the best bands anywhere. But in DC, we don't have the problems LA has with rioting at concerts and banned shows. The DC cops are used to deal ing with foreign dignitaries, politicians and potential terrorists and they're not worried about a few punk rockers. I understand LA has a lot more negativity to deal with, but I think the kids out there could do themselves a lot of good by not provoking problems. For instance, if you throw a bottle at a police car, what do you expect the police to do? Just turn their backs?!

A lot of punks get into where

they think it's cool to be an asshole--I'm not into that, none of us are," MacKaye butts in. Though he wouldn't come right out and say it,

MacKays wishes his "edge" would catch on with more of these kids.

"I believe in having a good feeling about life and benefitting from the things I'm doing with the band or whatever -- that's what Straight Edge is all about to me. To some people, it means different things: it's just so personal that we don't go around telling people how they can

become members of this club."
But why not? Isn't that what bands like Sadistic Exploits (Penn.), Code of Honor (LA) and Cress (U.K.) are You know the bringers of Great Truths? Preslar's temper flares: "Straight Edge is just a damn idea! A frame of mind! It means you adopt an attitude where you're not going to get obsessed with bad habits and hinder your development and abilities. But we aren't demanding others be like us. we're just presenting our thoughts. Some take Straight Edge very militantly, though, and say it means you can't touch a drop alcohol ever and others, like Jeff, still drink occasionally, but have a great grasp on Straight Edge. But at any rate, it's not a campaign and we're not preachers in any way!"
"Everyone adds their own inter-

pretations to Straight Edge,"
MacKaye calmly adds, "and what they
think it means to us. I hope the idea goes a million different dif-ferent directions, 'cause everyone is different, It'll never be some kind of social movement or a set of rules I sit down and write. Ive always been like this and I always

will be."
"Don't smoke/Don't drink/Don't fuck/At least I can fuckin' think/ I can't keep up/Can't keep up/Out of step with the world."







BLACK FLAG/Der LOWENBRAU-KELLER, MUNCHEN, BUNDSERE-PUBLIK DEUTSCHLAND--Europe finally got to see Black Flag.

After playing a few gigs in the states BF and the Minutemen flew to London, England, played there Feb. 10 and somewhere in Holland two days later.

Munich was their sixth gig The night before they played West Berlin. The night after 7ienna.

The tour was arranged by what Henry Rollins called Aggressive Rock Productions.

They headed back to London March 2, D.C. March 7 and if all went as planned, ended back in California, March 20

Five hundred, maybe more, assorted peoples paid 15 Deutsch Marks or about \$6.25 to see what west-coast hardcore was like.

Mohawks of all colors and lengths abounded. Leather, spikes, chains and jack boots were also prevalent. Skinheads, Teds, Euro-hippies, Rockers and curious, non descripts were all part of the crowd that came to witness the event.

Backstage, Henry Rollins streched out, arranged for a bottle of water onstage, fell off his chair, examined the red scratch marks on his abdomen and talked about the tour.

"We're playing to a new audience. A lot of the people haven't heard much of our stuff," Rollins said, "They also wonder about our appearance because we don't look like their idea of punk rockers.'

Looking more like unemployed youth who just raided the local Goodwill store, Black Flag stepped on stage and within seconds were blasting and contorting away.

Appearances didn't seem to ... matter to the crowd. Resembling mutant fans of the Mis fits, a nucleus of punks began to thrash within the first 30 seconds of BF's first tune. Some moved on the outskirts of the crowd but most of the non-dancers were watching Henry.

Twenty minutes into the extravaganza, the crowd got sick and tired of riot barriers and American college student bouncers keeping

them 10 feet from the stage. The ensuing tug-of-war resulted in a compromise of sorts. The crowd tore away the fence and the bouncers stayed between the stage and the thrashing mob.

Although one bouncer ended up with a mushed face because he didn't like being danced against and threatened a punk with death, the security forces stayed relatively calm and collected throughout the gig.
Students from the Maryland

University campus in Munich made up most of the security forces. Prior to the gig a few had ranked the job higher than rolling homosexuals on a Saturday night.

Most of the talk of breaking the heads of punk freaks wasjust that, talk. One gargantuan bouncer with long hair and cowboy boots was even heard to say... \*I just step back and let'em go off. If that's how they get off, great."

On the floor the punks took care of their own, picking each other up when they fell to the ground.

Black Flag tried their newest songs. My War, Scream, I Love You, What Can You Believe, Black Coffee and Slip It In.

Threatened with time enough for only one more song, Rollins, shirtless, tattooed and sweating, jumped from the stage to sing the final song in a more intimate atmosphere.

Fearing for Henry's life, the bouncers tried to pull him out of the crowd via the mic cord. They finally gave

Rollins got a lot of help singing Rise Above as punks crushed against him in the hopes of being amplified.

Others moved in close to touch Rollins and scratch skin samples from his body for their scrap book.

After at least 90 minutes of Hardcore and a three song encore, the fab Flags reluctantly left the stage.

A european tour is usally a good sign for a band, as far as success goes. Rollins said things aren't going great but they aren t starving.

"None of us have big cars or expensive drug addictions so we get by," he said."We live cheaply. We eat, sleep and play. I'm tired but not tired of playing. I just need some sleep.

Europe may get another chance to see Black Flag and other U.S. hardcore next year as according to Rollins, plans are being made for an EARTH WATCH tour.
